DURING THE SEMESTER beginning with Convocation Week, Luther Theological Seminary is offering the following elective courses open to members of the Senior Class who have a grade point average of 1.5 or over.

1. Dr. Iver Iversen The History of Doctrine
2. Dr. Janis Rozentals Exegetical Studies in the Epistles to Timothy
3. Dr. John P. Milton Messianic Prophecies
4. Dr. E. Theo. Bachmann Contemporary Europe and Its Churches
5. Dr. Edmund Smits Depth Psychology and Seelsorge
6. Rev. F. Norstad Pastoral Counselling

Each eligible Senior may register for one of the above courses. Credit gained under such elective may be applied in the future toward a M.Th. degree.

Each course will consist of a 2-hour Seminar period each week, or its equivalent.

The Seminars will normally be limited to 12 regular members.

A limited number of auditors will be permitted in each course. Auditors shall not receive credit, nor may they take active part in class discussion.
