It will be possible to register for two courses, which will offer six credits toward the M. Th. degree. The tuition charge is \$10.00 per quarter hour, or \$60.00 for a full load, whether the course is taken for credit or is audited.

No specific academic requirements are necessary for study at the Summer School, except for those interested in pursuing the Master's degree. Graduates of accredited seminaries are accepted without question. Members of other Christian denominations are welcome and encouraged. Qualified women holding the B. A. degree may apply for admission to course work but not to candidacy for the M. Th. degree.

Dormitory room charge is \$22.50 for the term. (Linens furnished upon request at additional cost.) The Boarding Club will serve meals at moderate cost.

Reservations should reach the Seminary by the first of June. Additional information will be available in January. You may obtain a brochure describing the courses by writing the Director of Graduate Studies.
