CHRISTIAN SOCIOLOGY

Dr. Smits: Theological Examination of the Marxian Interpretation of History

Each eligible Senior may register for one of the above courses. Credit gained under such elective may be applied in the future toward a M.Th. degree.

Each course will consist of a 2-hour Seminar period each week, or its equivalent.

The Seminars will normally be limited to 12 regular members.

A limited number of auditors will be permitted in each course. Auditors shall not receive credit, nor may they take active part in class discussion.

Qualified Seminary Graduates may also register for these electives. Credits earned may be applied toward a degree.
