Continuation Study Program

Beginning in the fall of 1965 Luther Theological Seminary will inaugurate a program of continuation studies for pastors. It is planned to conduct a series of four-day seminars, at various times during the school year, each centering on a single topic of theological or pastoral interest. In addition to the academic studies and discussions, provision will be made for spiritual growth and deepening through reading, meditation, and common worship.

A section of the Seminary dormitories will be set aside to provide comfortable living quarters for about fifteen or twenty pastors in each seminar group. The program will be subsidized, so that the cost to each registrant can be about \$25.00 for each four-day period, including tuition, board, and room.

A faculty committee is in charge of planning the program, and specific announcements as to dates, topics, and teachers will be made about April 15.

Dr. Bernhard Christensen has been named Director of Continuation Studies by the faculty, and will devote substantial time to developing its program.

Pastors in attendance at Convocation are invited to indicate their interest and to make suggestions both as to schedules and possible subjects of study.
